Kern County (Delano/McFarland): **OFM** – Biofix 3/8, 240DD. **PTB** – No trap activity. **CM** – No trap activity. **SJS** – Biofix 3/18, 62DD. Biofix 3/16, 72DD.

Tulare County (NE Kingsburg area): **OFM** – Biofix adjusted to 3/9 (from 3/4), 198DD. **CM** – 1 moth trapped 3/30. **CRS** – No males trapped. **SJS** – Biofix adjusted to 3/13 (from 3/5), no DD update.

Madera County: **OFM** - Biofix 3/17, 72DD **OLR** - Biofix 3/10, 112DD.

Merced County (Ballico & Winton areas): **OFM** – Biofix 3/7, 171DD. **CM** – No trap activity. **PTB** – No trap activity.

Sacramento County (Delta area): **OFM** – Biofix 3/14, 103DD. **CM** – No trap activity

Yuba County (Marysville): **OFM** – Biofix 3/8, 197DD. **CM** – No trap activity.

Butte County (Gridley): **OFM** – First moths trapped 3/8. **CM** – No trap activity. **PTB** – No trap activity.

NOTE: Codling moth emergence is expected in all areas 4/1-4/4.
