<u>Kern County</u> (Delano/McFarland): **OFM** – Inconsistent flight so far. Possible Biofix 3/2. 132DD since that date. **PTB** – First moth in north Kern Co. 3/12. **SJS** – A few trapped 2/21. Nothing since that time. **OLR** – Tentative Biofix 3/5.

**Tulare County** (NE Kingsburg area): **OFM** – No activity reported.

**Madera County: OFM** - No activity. **OLR** – Some moths trapped. No biofix yet.

Merced County (Ballico & Winton areas): OFM – Biofix 3/1, 118DD.

**Sacramento County** (Delta area): **OFM** – First moths trapped 3/4.

<u>Yuba County</u> (Marysville): **OFM** – Trap catches reported in area as early as 2/21. Biofix 3/4.

**<u>Butte County</u>** (Gridley): **OFM** – Trap catches reported in area as early as 2/21. No catch yet in orchards that were disrupted last season.

NOTE: Mark you calendars for the dates listed below.

MARCH: CM, CM-DA COMBO, DA, CM 10X, CRS, DBM and PTB traps should be set.
